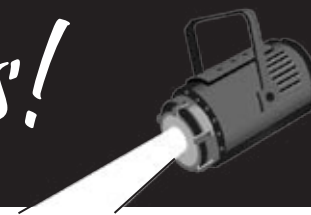

## Archdale, North Carolina

Archdale Pilgrim Holiness Church began at 7000 Tulane Drive, Archdale, NC, as a pioneer Home Missionary effort on July 19, 1998. From its first service in the 15' by 30' bathhouse that had been transformed into a small chapel, the hand of God has been on the endeavor. By March 1999, the congregation had outgrown the small chapel and moved to the Comfort Inn meeting room. While meeting there, nearly eight acres were purchased at 431 Aldridge Road, bordering Interstate 85. A 40' by 60' building was erected and the first service was held on October 17, 1999, with 100 in attendance. The Randy Keeling family ministered that day.

In March 2001, Archdale hosted the Conference Ministerial Convention and provided free lodging in the Comfort Inn, a free banquet, free evening refreshments and special room treats. During the Convention the Archdale Pilgrim Holiness Church was organized with 19 members. Since then, six more full members and two preparatory members have been added to the roll. An apartment, four Sunday School rooms, and another restroom were added and the whole building was bricked and put into use as of March 2003. Attendance has steadily increased and the services have been marked with God's presence.

On August 15, 2004, Lucas and Hannah ShROUT joined the ministry team as Minister of Music and Youth. They were installed in an impressive service that evening.



October 12-17, 2004, revival services were held with Rev. Darrell Stetler as evangelist. Average attendance was 122 with 29 first-time visitors. There were seekers in four of the six night services. Sunday, October 17, 2004, was Homecoming and the celebration of the fifth anniversary of occupancy of the new building with 176 in attendance. During that service, which included choir numbers,

a men's quartet, a solo, duets by the ShROUTs, special musical numbers by Bro. ShROUT and Richard Williams, and a powerful message by Bro. Stetler, the Vice-President of First Citizen's Bank announced the liquidation of the indebtedness against the property. The mortgage was burned by the trustees and board as the congregation sang the Doxology.

Archdale Pilgrim Holiness Church has also become the host church for the NC Area IHC each October. Archdale has been a strong supporter of the Conference programs and offerings from its inception. Foreign Missionary giving has increased each year with Archdale giving the largest Conference Self Denial Offering for 2003.
